MNSURE OPEN ENROLLMENT HAS STARTED!

MNsure Open Enrollment has started, but what does that really mean?

Who is affected by Open Enrollment?

Open enrollment is the time of year when we can enroll or change plans in the MNsure Marketplace or the private health insurance market. Employers offering insurance and the Medicare system also have open enrollment periods each year.

Households with Medical Assistance and MNcare can enroll ANY time during the year – so open enrollment doesn't affect them.

Open Enrollment Dates:

November 1 – December 22!

During open enrollment, if a consumer qualifies for either a subsidized or unsubsidized MNsure Qualified Health Plan, they must select from the options available through MNsure and enroll through MNsure. Their insurance coverage will begin January 1, 2021.



What is a MNsure Navigator?

- A MNsure Navigator is a person who has been trained to help with the application for health insurance in the Marketplace (MNSURE) in Minnesota.
- A Navigator will walk through the application with you, help you understand your program eligibility and next steps, and serve as your advocate.

WHAT IS A MNSURE BROKER?

A MNsure broker is a licensed insurance agent certified with MNsure to provide information and guidance on plan selection in the Marketplace.

MNsure brokers and navigators work together as a team to provide you, the consumer, with the best possible experience.

Navigators specialize in completing the MNsure application and Brokers specialize in plan selection.

Blackduck and Kelliher Food Program
